Dr. Goh Yi Sheng Receives 2 Internal Grants

Congratulations to Dr Goh Yi Sheng on receiving two internal grants: The Sunway University Kick-Start Grant and The FCRI Seed Corn Grant.

With the **Sunway University Kick-Start Grant**, Dr Goh will embark as principal investigator alongside co-investigator Dr Ooi Pei Boon (SMLS) on the research topic, "*Giving is Getting: Exploring Possibilities of Time Bank Concept in Malaysia*". With the aim to understand the key concerns of the post retirement life of ageing individuals without children, along with the long-term goal of creating a Time Bank system in Malaysia, they seek to examine the perceived benefits, concerns, and intentions to participate in Time Banks in Malaysia.

Moreover, the **FCRI Seed Corn Grant** will be utilised toward research entitled, *"Towards Understanding and Incorporating Senior Citizens' Needs in Disaster Response Operations (UNDERSTAND)*", with Dr Goh and Prof Juliana Sutanto (Lancaster University) as principal investigators and Dr Catherine Lee (SOA) and Yang Hu (Lancaster University) as co-investigators. The research looks to identify the needs of senior citizens in order to optimise the design and enhance the performance of urban disaster management in Malaysia. Which in turn helps build an equitable and age-inclusive, disaster-resilient urban space for the ageing population.

Dr. Pauline - Webinar Series with ISEAS-Yusof Ishak Institute

On the 29th of March 2022, Dr. Pauline organised a web series with ISEAS-Yusof Ishak Institute on the topic of Moderating the Global Social Media Information Ecosystem. The webinar featured presentations from industry experts from Google, Twitter, and Meta and was moderated by Dr. Pauline. Together they explored the issue of content moderation on social media platforms and how policies are formulated and implemented to manage sensitive and controversial topics while balancing different moral, ethical, and cultural standards. The webinar turned out to be a success as there were more than 180 participants who attended.
