## **Dr Pauline Leong Guests in CHRISTE Youtube Podcast Channel**




Guesting on the CHRISTE podcast channel on YouTube, Dr Pauline Leong Pooi Yin along with another lecturer from Monash University was invited to discuss the preliminary findings of their research, titled, "Covid-19 Pandemic: Are Christians in Malaysia and Singapore Returning to Church? Why?". The Christian community worldwide was faced

with many challenges due to the pandemic, one of which was the prohibition of on-site worship services in churches. The Christian Institute for Theological Engagement (CHRISTE) is in the midst of funding crucial scholarly research on this subject matter from research grants awarded by the Cornelius Cardinal Sim Professorial Chair in Theology and Dialogue. Interviewed by the Rev. Deacon Professor Dr Sherman Kuek OFS (Cornelius Cardinal Sim Professor of Theology and Dialogue), Dr Pauline and her fellow research associate talked about what their research aims to achieve in order to benefit the many Christian communities around the region in their next step.

Congratulations to Dr Adrian Lee from the Department of Film & Performing Arts on the publication of his new book titled "Malaysian Cinema in the New Millennium"! The book explores a new approach on the study of multiculturalism in cinemas through analysing how the new wave of filmmakers use cosmopolitan themes to champion cultural diversity.

Dr Adrian questions how 'Malaysian Digital Indies' (MDI) repositioned Malaysian cinema globally in recent years. Subsequently, the book provides a new light on the way socio-economics and politics influenced new genres and forms of post 2000 filmmakers as well as illustrating the interactions between socio-economics and commercial cinema and politics.
